

Sport Premium statement 2023-2024

At Courthouse, we use the sport premium funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport that we offer. We use the premium to:

- develop or add to the PE and sport activities that we already offer and
- build capacity and capability within the school to ensure that improvements made now, will benefit pupils joining the school in future years.

There are 5 key indicators that we expect to see improvement across:

- the engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity (the Chief Medical Officer guidelines recommend that all children and young people aged 5 to 18 engage in at least 60 minutes of physical activity a day, of which 30 minutes should be in school),
- the profile of PE and sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole-school improvement,
- increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport,
- broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils and
- Increased participation in competitive sport.

In 2023-2024 we received **£19,782** in order to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and Sport at Courthouse.
